

Lets Talk Logic

<u>Being</u>	<u>Properties</u>	<u>We Will Denote As</u>
God →	An infinite being Creates universes All knowing . . .	God = A
Man →	A finite being Does not create universes Limited in Knowledge . . .	Man = ~A

The only variable here is A. Here is a truth table consisting of (A) and (A and ~A).

<u>A</u>	<u>A and ~A</u>
T	T and F → False
F	F and T → False

What does this mean?

1. God and Man are shown to be two opposite beings because of the content of their properties.
2. (A) has two values. True and False
3. (~A) is defined as (not-A). (~A) has truth values opposite of (A).
4. (A and ~A) means 'A being who is God (A) and Man (~A) at the same time.
5. For the conjunction 'and' to be true it is necessary for both to be true.
6. In all situations of (A), (A and ~A) has a truth value of False.
7. This means that it is *always* not possible to have a being who is both God (A) *and* Man (~A) at the same time.

God created all things. He created man and all the aspects of man including his process of thought. In order for man to think logically, logic must have been given to him by God. God created logic.

One would say, "Well, let's not use logic to define God. He is not bound by logic."

I would say, "Does God want to confuse us about his nature by giving to us ways of thought that cannot comprehend who he is? Would God actually want people, his creation whose purpose is to serve him in truth, to not understand who he is? Does God want to hide himself from us by not allowing us to understand who he is? I think not."

Conclusion: It is impossible for any being to be both God and Man at the same time. Never has this occurred and never will it occur.
